WHEREAS, one of the many functions of the Autauga County Probate Office is the maintenance of historical documents;

WHEREAS, the Old Autauga Historical Society was founded for the purpose of sharing and preserving the history of Old Autauga County, which includes present day Autauga County and areas west of the Coosa River in Elmore County;

WHEREAS, much of Autauga County's historical documents are maintained in bound books and are not available in electronic form or available for online research.

WHEREAS, in effort to provide online access to our county's historical documents and provide additional maintenance of those records, the Autauga County Probate Office implemented a process to scan those documents for electronic recording and access.

WHEREAS, the members of the Old Autauga Historical Society volunteered to take on the project of back scanning these documents. This has not only been a cost benefit to Autauga County, but also a historical benefit to our county, in that the volunteers have a vast knowledge about the county's history and that information can be recorded and documented along with the scanned historical documents.

WHEREAS, the work of Old Autauga Historical Society volunteers is vital to preserve the integrity of our historical documents. They have volunteered more than 588 over the past 17 months and have electronically recorded more than 36 years of historical records dated back to December 15, 1823.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners for Autauga County, do hereby recognize and celebrate the dedicated work of the Old Autauga Historical Society, and do hereby recognize its members for their hard work in preserving our county's historica documents and urge the citizens of Autauga County to demonstrate their gratitude for the member—of the Old Autauga Historical Society.
