PROCLAMATION

Whereas; October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM), and our goal is to promote a better understanding of domestic violence and its impact on our communities.

Whereas; Domestic violence is a serious violent crime that includes any combination of physical, verbal, financial, emotional, and technological abuse and/or control. Even if the abuse never includes physical violence, the effect on victims can be as severe.

Whereas; For far too long, domestic violence was ignored or treated as a private matter where victims were left to suffer in silence without hope of intervention, afraid to seek help or know where to turn.

Whereas; The traumatic effects of domestic violence also impact family members and entire communities, with children often witnessing the violence or becoming victims themselves.

Whereas; Despite considerable progress in reducing domestic violence, 37.5% of Alabama women and 29.5% of Alabama men will experience intimate partner physical violence, intimate partner sexual violence and/or intimate partner stalking in their lifetimes and

Whereas; while women between the ages of 16 and 24 are among the most vulnerable to intimate partner violence, domestic violence affects people regardless of gender, age, sexual orientation, race, or religion.

Whereas; Domestic Violence impacts millions of people each year, but it can be prevented. The theme of this year's campaign is "#WhylCare".

Whereas; #WhylCare asks that we make a commitment to ourselves, our community, and society at large to learn about domestic violence so we can feel confident in our ability to respond with compassion, interrupt acts of aggression and abuse, and make a difference in a victim's life.

Now, therefore, we the County Commissioners of Autauga County, Alabama, join others across Alabama and the nation in supporting victims of domestic violence, as well as local programs, state coalizions national organizations, and other agencies nationwide who are committed to increasing public awareness of domestic violence and sending a clear message to abusers that domestic violence is not toleraged in Alabama.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Autauga County Commission that, should it voluntarily withdraw from the Fund prior to Sept. 30, 2024, it agrees to return the 2024 Longevity Bonus provided by the Fund, plus five (5) percent annual interest.
